A message from our new Principal, Steph Koble

Dear Parents & Carers,

I am thrilled to introduce myself as the new principal of Gembrook PS from Week 3, Term 2 (April 29, 2024)! I have big shoes to fill, with Kerri-Lin Drew serving as Acting Principal for the last eighteen months as an exemplary school leader; building strong community connections, and a student-centred culture, amongst many other achievements. I hope to build on these strong foundations alongside her for many years to come.

Before I tell you about some of my hopes for the term ahead, I need to answer the biggest question I have been asked: who am I? In one sentence, I am an experienced school and system leader with a passion for empowering a school community to make every child feel successful.

Prior to my career in education, I was in Accounting and Public Relations. Both of these career paths were somewhat comparable to *Goldilocks and the Three Bears* – they just didn't feel quite right!

Upon starting my Masters of Education (specialising in Primary Education), I knew I had found my niche and my passion; the moment I stepped into the classroom, I knew I was in the right place. I am lucky that my teaching career has taken me all over the state and internationally to a little town called Oshkosh in Wisconsin, USA where I learnt a lot about bitterly cold winters and the Green Bay Packers.

On my return, I took a role with the Department of Education as a School Improvement Leader. I missed the celebrations, the school camps, the games in the yard, knowing what's happening for a student and being able to support them on their journey. I missed seeing the impact that educators, in partnership with families, have on students learning. And I really missed the 'aha' moments.

In summary, I wanted to be back in a school that valued community. One that wasn't too big so I could know everyone in it. One where I could further my dream of making every child feel successful and valued. I am so excited to begin my time with you all at the end of April! I just have a quick preplanned holiday to Japan to take before I arrive – I promise I'll bring back matcha tea and weird-flavoured Kit Kats!

In Term 2, my main goal is to immerse myself in our school community and to make sure every member is heard. From students to staff, parents to volunteers, I want to listen and get to know what everyone values and hopes for in our school. Be prepared: I love a good yarn! Expect to see me walking our grounds before and after school or out at Kiss and Drop whenever possible (please approach me to say hello if you see me), visiting each classroom to greet our students each day and having an open door as often as possible.

To our students, I cannot wait to meet you all! I hope that you are excited about the holiday break and that you get outside and enjoy the beautiful weather we're having. It is going to be a fun second term of learning together!



PE - Whats happening in Term 2

Prep - In Term 2, prep students will continue to build on their fundamental motor skills of throwing, catching and kicking, and locomotive skills of running, dodging and leaping. These skills will support students to learn the foundations of basketball, A.F.L. football, soccer, netball, and some basic rules of the sports. Students running skills will be put to the test in a fun and supportive environment, during our 'Junior Cross-Country Carnival'.

Grade 1-2

During Term 2, students will further develop their understanding and abilities in invasion games and sports like, basketball, A.F.L. football, and netball. Grade 1-2 students will concentrate on grasping the fundamental rules of the sports, and experimenting with basic strategies over the course of the unit. They will also have the chance to take part in the 'Cross-Country Carnival.'

Grade 3-4

In grades 3-4, students will initiate the development of fundamental game sense and strategizing abilities within invasion games and various sports, such as A.F.L. football, netball, soccer, and basketball. Through a structured program spanning several weeks, students will progressively build skills, grasp tactical concepts, and understand strategic approaches essential to these sports. Subsequently, they will form teams and engage in friendly matches against their peers. Additionally, grade 3-4 students will participate in a supportive 'Cross Country Carnival,' where they can showcase their running skills. Furthermore, selected students will have the opportunity to compete against district schools.
