The survey is conducted online and will only take approximately 20 minutes to complete.



Once available, I will communicate a summary of the survey results with staff, school council and then the broader community via the newsletter.


#### Supporting Students' Academic Achievement

### School Council Snapshot from the 21st August, 2024

This School Council saw us welcoming new school council member, Ian, to our midst. We are excited to have Ian joining us and welcome inquiries from all parents about the possibility of sitting in on a meeting or even joining as a regular school councilor. Together, we make decisions that set the direction of the school. School Council:

- helps create and check the school's budget
- contributes to the school strategic plan, and
- make decisions on policies like investments, payments by parents, dress code.

#### Strategic Planning

The Gembrook Primary School 6-month Annual Improvement Plan (AIP) was presented to School Council. The AIP outlines how the school will implement the goals and key improvement strategies from our 4-yearly School Strategic Plan. This AIP will see the school:

- revising our whole school approach to mathematics teaching and assessment,
- strengthening our Foundation approach to teaching phonics,
- introducing decodable readers to the Foundation Year 2 learning space,
- refining our student support structures, including Individual Education Plans, Student Safety Plans, and introducing Attendance Plans,
- establishing lunchtime clubs that promote student wellbeing and positive relationships,
- auditing community events in preparation for 2025.

#### **OshClub**

School councilors discussed the current before and after school care offering by OshClub in preparation for whether the contract should be renewed for 2025.

**Excursions, Camps and Activities:** 

- Year 5/6 Parliament Excursion, September 3<sup>rd</sup>, including a visit to Victorian Parliament and ACMI for grade 5 & 6 students at a cost of \$20 per student.
- Year 5/6 EDEC Girls Footy, September 9<sup>th</sup>, whereby Year 5/6 girls will be invited to walk to Gembrook Football Grounds to compete against other local schools at a cost of \$10 per student.
- Year 1/2 Science Incursion, September 9<sup>th</sup>, Grade 1/2 students will participate in a 60-minute incursion hosted by Meagan from For The Love of Science at a cost of \$10 per student.
- **Division Athletics, September 18**<sup>th</sup>, students from Year 4 6 who qualified in our school athletics will compete in our Division Athletics competition.

#### **Buildings and Grounds:**

School Council was updated on current buildings and grounds works, including:

- The planned works for the library are on the backburner as the school waits to hear whether we have been approved for a \$20,000 grant, so that school funds can be spent on books and resources rather than on shelving!
- The school will be installing a babel drum, and further mushroom seats over the upcoming school holidays. We are
  also renovating our old chicken coop into a play shed for students to freely access outdoor play equipment and
  building a cubby where the stage currently sits.

#### About the School Saving Bonus

The Victorian Government is making life that little bit easier for families by providing a one-off \$400 School Saving Bonus.

This support will help cover the cost of school uniforms, textbooks, and school activities like s, excursions and sports

The School Saving Bonus is in addition to existing and continuing means-tested supports for Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF) and the Affordable School Uniforms Program.

The School Saving Bonus will be provided to schools and families in Term 4, 2024.

#### Who receives the School Saving Bonus

The School Saving Bonus is available for parents and carers of all Victorian government school students from Prep to Year 12 in 2025, except for full-fee international students, home schooled students, TAFE students and students attending kindergarten in 2025.

#### Actions for parents and carers

Parents and carers of children who meet the School Saving Bonus eligibility above are required to do the following by Friday 18 October 2024:

Complete enrolment

If your child, or children are changing government school for Term 1 2025, or starting Prep or Year 7 in 2025, please complete enrolment. For more information, read about Enrolling in School.

· Check your contact information

Ensure your contact information is up to date with your school. You can check this information by contacting your school directly.

#### Accessing the \$400 School Saving Bonus

You do not need to apply for the School Saving Bonus.

The Department of Education will email you in November 2024 with your \$400 School Saving Bonus. You will be able to access it via an online system

You can decide how to best use the School Saving Bonus for your family's needs. You can choose how to allocate the \$400 in the online system

The bonus can be used towards 2025 school costs, which may include:

· camps, trips, excursions and incursions
